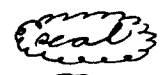
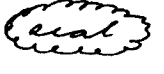


Thornton & wife
 To 3^d Deed.
 Hensley.

This Deed, made this 13th day of December, in
 the year, One thousand eight hundred, and Eighty nine,
 Between J. B. T. Thornton, and Fannie B. Thornton his wife
 of Prince William County, in state of Virginia, of the first
 part, and Joseph H. Hensley of the same County, and state,
 of the second part. ~~Witnesseth~~. That in consid-
 eration, of the sum of Seven Hundred and Fifty Dollars,
 the said J. B. T. Thornton, and Fannie B. Thornton his wife,
 do grant unto the said Joseph H. Hensley with General
 Warranty, all that certain tract or parcel of land, lying
 and being situate near Buckhall, in Prince William
 County, Virginia, known as the Kinghelow Place, ~~contai-~~
 ning, about One Hundred Acres, be the same, more
 or less, and bounded as follows, - to wit. Beginning
 at the south western corner of the said place, at the
 junction of the old Buckhall road, and the present
 Buckhall and Manassas road, thence with the old Buck-
 hall road, and in a northerly direction to Evans line,
 thence in an easterly direction with Evans line to Low-
 mers line, near the road leading to Lewis Pagnessethers,
 thence with said Lowmers line, and up said road, in a
 southerly direction to Bacon-Race road, thence with
 said road to the Methodist Church, near the junction of
 Bacon-race road, and the Manassas & Buckhall road, and
 thence with the said road to the point of beginning, ~~un-~~
 less and except the family Grave yard, which is hereby ex-
 pressly reserved (not to exceed one eighth of an acre) with
 perpetual right of ingress and egress to the said parties
 of the first part, and their heirs across the land conveyed
 in this deed. The said J. B. T. Thornton, and Fannie B. Thornton
 his wife covenant that they have the right to convey the
 said land to the grantee, that they have done no act
 to encumber the said land, that the grantee shall have
 quiet possession of the said land, free from all encum-
 brances, and that they the said parties of the first
 part, will execute such further assurance of the said
 land, as may be requisite. ~~Witnesseth~~.

This Deed, made this day of November, in the year
 One thousand, eight hundred and eighty nine, Between Joseph
 S. Breden and Rebecca Jane Breden his wife, of the County of
 Prince William V^a parties of the first part, and E. E. Herdick
 J. B. T. Thornton of the same County and state, parties of the
 second part, ~~Witnesseth~~: That the said parties
 of the first part, do grant unto the said parties of the sec-
 ond part, the following property, To wit: All that certain
 tract or parcel of land lying and being situate, in Prince
 William County, Virginia, containing 137 acres, 3 rods
 and 11 poles, and is the same land purchased by
 the said Jos. S. Breden of Rebecca M. Keir and others, by
 deed bearing date, May 19th, 1884, and recorded, in
 the Clerk's Office, of the Clerk of said County, in Book
 34 p 64 to which deed for a more accurate des-
 cription of said land reference is hereby made, and
 also one saw-mill with all fixtures connected with
 and attached thereto, and one 15 horse power engine
 known as the "Portable Erie City Engine and wheels".
 In Trust, to secure to Jno. A. Hornbaker, of the County of
 Prince William the payment of the sum of Eleven Hun-
 dred Dollars, with interest from date, as evidenced by
 six bonds, the first five for Two Hundred Dollars each
 and last for One hundred dollars, payable in one, two,
 three, four, five and six years, with interest payable an-
 nually, payable to John A. Hornbaker or order; In the
 event that default, shall be made, in the payment of either
 of the above mentioned bonds, as they become due and
 payable, then the trustees or either of them, on being re-
 quired to do so by the said John A. Hornbaker his executors,
 administrators, or assigns, shall sell the property hereby con-
 veyed. And it is covenanted and agreed between the
 parties aforesaid, that in case of a sale the same shall
 be made after first advertising the time, place, and terms
 thereof, for thirty days, in some newspaper published in
 the County of Prince William, and upon the following terms
 to wit, - for cash or to so much of the proceeds, as may
 be necessary to defray the expenses of executing this
 trust, the fees for drawing and recording this deed,
 if then unpaid, and to discharge the amount of
 money then payable upon the said bonds; and if
